Over time, my work grew in size and impact: I continued to develop both commercial and residential clients and focussed on murals. Whether I am creating murals for businesses, or working on private commissioned pieces, I always bring a sense of joy to my work. Flowers and animals in particular are still a favorite motif; | feel mother nature is calling me to explore her.

I'm thirty-seven[c] now and have been creating murals for eight years. I love the freedom of having a job that doesn't feel like one. During Covid I moved to San Miguel de Allende thinking it would be a quiet reflective period. On the contrary, I have been busier than ever!


Suzy Taylor was an interior designer and magazine editor in New York City when she took a painting course at the famous Art Students League in New York City. She got hooked on painting.




Lindsay Duval
